The floor was opened for nominations for the position of Minister of Presbytery.

Randy Booth nominated Gene Franklin.

Randy Booth asked for other nominations and, after none was offered, closed the floor for nominations.

Gene Franklin was elected Minister of Presbytery by unanimous vote.

Minister Franklin assumed the chair and opened the floor for nominations for the position of Minister pro tempore of Presbytery.

Gil Shivers nominated Todd Davis.

Minister Franklin asked for additional nominations and, after none was offered, closed the floor for nominations.

Todd Davis was elected by unanimous voice vote.

Pastor Booth moved that the Minister of Presbytery be elected as one of the Council Delegates. Steve Wilkins seconded the motion.

Gil Shivers clarified that this motion did not apply to the Book of Procedures and is not binding upon future elections of Council Delegates

The motion carried by voice vote.

Minister Franklin opened the floor for nominations for the second Delegate to Council.

Gil Shivers nominated Steve Wilkins. Pastor Wilkins withdrew his name from nomination.

Steve Wilkins nominated Randy Booth.

Minister Franklin asked for additional nominations and, after none was offered, closed nominations.

Randy Booth was elected unanimously by voice vote.

Bill Izard moved to adjourn the Presbytery meeting. Gil Shivers seconded the motion, and it passed by unanimous vote.

The meeting was adjourned following prayer by Minister Franklin.
